A BILL FOR AN ACT

To further amend Public Law No. 8-75, as amended, by further amending section 2, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 8-79, 8-116, 8-145, 9-013, 9-065, 9-119 and 10-77, to modify funds appropriated therein for the State of Yap, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1 Section 1. Section 2 of Public Law No. 8-75, as amended by Public Laws Nos.  
2 8-79, 8-116, 8-145, 9-013, 9-065, 9-119, and 10-77, is hereby further


