

A BILL FOR AN ACT

To appropriate the sum of \$80,000 from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2011, to be channeled through the Micronesia Red Cross, for the purpose of contributing to the international relief effort for the recent disasters in Australia and New Zealand, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1           Section 1. Appropriation. The sum of \$80,000, or so much  
2 thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the  
3 General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal  
4 year ending September 30, 2011, for the purpose of contributing to  
5 the international relief effort for the recent disasters in  
6 Australia and New Zealand. These funds shall be channeled through  
7 the Micronesia Red Cross.

8           Section 2. Allotment and management of funds and lapse date.

9           (1) All funds appropriated by this act shall be allotted,  
10 managed, administered, and accounted for in accordance with  
11 applicable law, including, but not limited to, the Financial  
12 Management Act of 1979. The allottee of the funds appropriated by  
13 this act shall be the President of the Federated States of  
14 Micronesia, or his designee. The allottee shall be responsible  
15 for ensuring that these funds, or so much thereof as may be  
16 necessary, are used solely for the purpose specified in this act,  
17 and that no obligations are incurred in excess of the sum  
18 appropriated.

1           (2) The authority of the allottee to obligate funds  
2 appropriated by this act shall lapse as of December 31, 2011.

3           Section 3. Effective date. This act shall become law upon  
4 approval by the President of the Federated States of Micronesia or  
5 upon its becoming law without such approval.
