## A BILL FOR AN ACT

To further amend section 1 and 2 of Public Law No. 16-18, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 16-24, 16-32, 16-39, 16-45, 16-54, 16-67, 17-04, 17-14 and 17-26, to change the use and allottee of certain funds previously appropriated therein to fund public project and social programs in the States of Pohnpei and Chuuk, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

Section 2. Section 2 of Public Law No. 16-18, as amended
by Public Laws Nos. 16-24 and 17-14, is hereby further amended
to read as follows:
"Section 2. Allotment and management of funds and lapse
date. All funds appropriated by this act shall be
allotted, managed, administered and accounted for in
accordance with applicable laws, including, but not
limited to, the Financial Management Act of 1979. The
allottee shall be responsible for ensuring that these
funds, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are used
solely for the purpose specified in this act, and that
no obligations are incurred in excess of the sum
appropriated. The allottee of the funds appropriated
under section 1 of this act shall be the President of
the Federated States of Micronesia or his designee;
PROVIDED THAT the allottee of funds appropriated under
sections $1(4)(a)$ , $[\frac{b}{a}]$ , $(d)$ , $(e)$ and $(f)$ of this act
shall be the Chuuk Commission on Improvement Project

1	(CSCIP) and that the allottee of funds appropriated		
2	under subsection 1(4)(f)(vi) of this act shall be the		
3	President of the College of Micronesia-FSM. The allottee		
4	of funds appropriated under section 1(4)(b) of this act		
5	shall be the Mortlock Islands Development Authority		
6	(MIDA). The allottee of funds appropriated under section		
7	1(1) of this act shall be the Governor of the State of		
8	Yap. The authority of the allottee to obligate funds		
9	appropriated by this act shall not lapse."		
10	Section 2. This act shall become law upon approval		
11	by the President of the Federated States of Micronesia		
12	or upon its becoming law without such approval.
