
A BILL FOR AN ACT

To amend sections 1, 2 and 12 of Public Law No. 17-79, as amended by Public Law No. 17-78, to appropriate from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia supplemental funding in the amount of \$75,000 for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2012, to provide medical assistance to Yap State, to create an allottee of funding, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1 Section 1. Section 1 of Public Law No. 17-19, as amended
2 by Public Law No. 17-28 is hereby amended to read as follows:

3 "Section 1. Purpose. The purpose of this act is to
4 appropriate the sum of \$~~[45,277,053]~~ 45,352,053, or
5 so much thereof as may be necessary, from the
6 General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia
7 for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2012, for
8 the purpose of funding the operations of all
9 branches of the National Government of the Federated
10 States of Micronesia, its agencies, various
11 programs, grants, subsidies and contributions. Of
12 the total amount of funds appropriated herein,
13 \$4,437,560 shall be deemed to come from funds
14 available under the amended Compact from the
15 education sector subject to the receipt of Grant
16 Awards under the amended Compact; \$1,176,656 shall
17 be deemed to come from funds available under the
18 Supplemental Education Grant; \$878,750 shall be

1 deemed to come from funds available under the amended
2 Compact from the health sector subject to the receipt
3 of Grant Awards under the amended Compact; \$329,598
4 shall be deemed to come from funds available under
5 the amended Compact from the capacity building
6 sector; \$-0- shall be deemed to come from funds
7 available under the amended Compact from the private
8 sector development sector; and \$1,194,212 shall be
9 deemed to come from funds available under the
10 amended Compact from the infrastructure sector."

11 Section 2. Section 8 of Public Law No. 17-19, as amended
12 by Public Law No. 17-28, is hereby amended to read as follows:

13 "Section 8. Grants, Subsidies and Contributions.

14 The sum of \$~~[9,476,230]~~ 9,551,230, or so much
15 thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated
16 from the General Fund of the Federated States of
17 Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30,
18 2012, for the following grants, subsidies and
19 contributions during fiscal year 2012. Of the total
20 amount of funds appropriated herein, \$-0- shall be
21 deemed to come from funds available under the amended
22 Compact from the education sector; and \$-0- shall be
23 deemed to come from funds available under the
24 Supplemental Education Grant. The sum appropriated
25 by this section shall be apportioned as follows:

21 Section 3. Section 12 of Public Law No. 17-19, as amended by
 22 Public Law No. 17-28, is hereby amended to read as follows:

23 "Section 12. Allotment and management of funds and
 24 lapse dates.

25 (1) General provisions.

1 (a) All funds appropriated by this act shall
2 be allotted, managed, administered and accounted for
3 in accordance with applicable law, including, but not
4 limited to, the Financial Management Act of 1979.

5 (b) The allottees shall be responsible for
6 ensuring that these funds, or so much thereof as may
7 be necessary, are used solely for the purposes
8 specified in this act, and that no obligations are
9 incurred in excess of the sums appropriated.

10 (2) Allottees. The allottees of the funds
11 appropriated by this act are as follows:

12 (a) Section 2 - the allottee of these funds
13 shall be the President of the Federated States of
14 Micronesia;

15 (b) Section 3 - the allottee of these funds
16 shall be the Speaker of the Congress of the Federated
17 States of Micronesia;

18 (c) Section 4 - the allottee of these funds
19 shall be the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of
20 the Federated States of Micronesia;

21 (d) Section 5 - the allottee of these funds
22 shall be the Public Auditor of the Federated States
23 of Micronesia;

24 (e) Sections 6 through 9 - the allottee of
25 these funds shall be the President of the Federated

1 States of Micronesia; PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that for the
2 following subsections of sections 8 through 9 of this
3 act:

4 (i) Section 8, subsection (13)(a)
5 through (d) - the allottee of these funds shall be
6 the Chief Justice of the respective State Supreme
7 Court,

8 (ii) Section 8, subsection (13)(r) - the
9 allottee of these funds shall be the Governor of the
10 State of Yap,

11 (~~iii~~) iii) Section 9(1)(a) - the allottee
12 of these funds shall be the President of the College
13 of Micronesia-FSM,

14 (~~iii~~) iv) Section 9, subsection (12)(a)
15 through (d) - the allottee of these funds shall be
16 the Chief Justice of the FSM Supreme Court.

17 (3) Lapse date. The authority of the allottees to
18 obligate funds appropriated by this act shall lapse
19 as of September 30, 2012; PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that the
20 funds appropriated under section 9 of this act shall
21 not lapse; PROVIDED FURTHER, that for the funds
22 appropriated by section 9, subsection (16) of this
23 act, the authority of the allottee to obligate funds
24 shall lapse on December 30, 2011."

25 Section 4. This act shall become law upon approval by the

1 President of the Federated States of Micronesia or upon its
2 becoming law without such approval.
