

A RESOLUTION

Approving a grant proposal in the amount of \$1,360,465, to fund the Linking Actions for Unmet Needs in Children's Health Project, and its submission to the United States Department of Health and Human Services, Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Agency.

1           WHEREAS, the FSM Department of Health and Social Affairs  
2 prepared a grant proposal, titled: "Linking Actions for Unmet  
3 Needs in Children's Health Project" (Project LAUNCH) with a total  
4 project cost of \$1,360,465; and

5           WHEREAS, this grant proposal is prepared for submission to  
6 the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Agency of the U.S.  
7 Department of Health and Human Services; and

8           WHEREAS, the proposal presents a new model in mental health  
9 services, a care delivery for children, consisting of specific  
10 goals and implementation strategies that if approved, shall be  
11 carried out by the FSM Department of Health and Social Affairs  
12 and will benefit children in the FSM who are in need of health  
13 care services; and

14           WHEREAS, section 211 title 55 of the Code of the Federated  
15 States of Micronesia states that prior to the submittal of any  
16 first year or first time application, proposal, or pre  
17 expenditure report such application, proposal, or pre expenditure  
18 report shall be submitted to Congress for its review and approval  
19 by resolution; now, therefore,

20           BE IT RESOLVED by the Eighteenth Congress of the Federated

1 States of Micronesia, Third Special Session, 2014, that Congress  
2 hereby approves the \$1,360,465 grant proposal, to fund the  
3 Linking Actions for Unmet Needs in Children's Health Project, and  
4 its submission to the U.S. Department of Health and Human  
5 Services, Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Agency; and

6 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this  
7 resolution to be transmitted to the President of the Federated  
8 States of Micronesia and the Secretary of the Department of  
9 Health and Social Affairs.
