
A BILL FOR AN ACT

To amend sections 1 and 9 of Public Law No. 20-42, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 20-54, 20-64 and 20-67 and 20-83, in order to appropriate **\$10,000,000** of additional funds from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2018, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1 Section 1. Section 1 of Public Law No. 20-42, as amended by
2 Public Law No. 20-54, is hereby further amended to read as
3 follows:

4 "Section 1. Purpose. The purpose of this act is to
5 appropriate the sum of ~~\$(83,534,726)~~ 93,534,726 from the
6 General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the
7 fiscal year ending September 30, 2018, for the purpose of
8 funding the operations of all branches of the National
9 Government of the Federated States of Micronesia, its
10 agencies, various programs, grants, subsidies and
11 contributions and Capital and Human Resources Development.
12 The National Government's share of the Amended Compact
13 funds has been reduced to zero; EXCEPT THAT; the National
14 Government will retain 10 percent of the Supplemental
15 Education Grant funds as is reflected in the budget for
16 the Department of Education. The sum appropriated herein
17 shall be apportioned as follows:"

18 Section 2. Section 9 of Public Law No. 20-42, as amended by
19 Public Laws Nos. 20-54, 20-64, 20-67 and 20-83, is hereby further

1 amended to read as follows:

2 "Section 9. Capital and Human Resources Development.

3 The sum of \$~~[38,400,179]~~ 48,400,179, or so much thereof
 4 as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the
 5 General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for
 6 the fiscal year ending September 30, 2018, for the
 7 following capital improvements, development programs,
 8 and projects and human resources development. Of the
 9 total amount of funds appropriated herein, **\$1,246,022**
 10 shall be deemed to come from funds available under the
 11 Amended Compact from the Supplemental Education Grant
 12 and **\$5,252,250** shall be deemed to come from funds
 13 available under the Amended Compact from Compact Sector
 14 Grants. The sum appropriated by this section shall be
 15 apportioned as follows:
