A BILL FOR AN ACT

To make Kim Young Po eligible for naturalization as a citizen of the Federated States of Micronesia, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1 Section 1. Kim Young Po, a citizen of Korea now residing in Kosrae
 2 State, by virtue of his compliance with the provisions of section 204 of title 7 of
 3 the Code of the Federated States of Micronesia, is declared eligible for
 4 Federated States of Micronesia citizenship, subject to approval by the
 5 President of the Federated States of Micronesia in the exercise of the power
 6 granted to him by said section 204 of title 7 of the Code of the Federated
 7 States of Micronesia.

8 Section 2. This act shall become law upon approval by the President of
 9 the Federated States of Micronesia or upon its becoming law without such
 10 approval.
